2 MS. RYAN: Okay.

3 THE COURT: It would be helpful not only to this  
4 Court but to a reviewing court in determining the issues.

5 Mr. Lankford, would have you any objection to that?

6 MR. LANKFORD: Your Honor, I would like to make an  
7 objection for the record as to that document and to the  
8 testimony of Agent Klotz.

9 The defendant would take the position and ask the Court to  
10 disregard the testimony of Agent Klotz because of the lack of  
11 foundation and qualification of the witness to offer such  
12 testimony, and would object to the document for the same  
13 reason.

14 THE COURT: All right. The objection will be  
15 overruled, and that document can either be marked as a  
16 Plaintiff's or Government's Exhibit Number 1, or even the  
17 Court's Exhibit Number 1.

18 In the first place, to deal with the objection, the  
19 agent's testimony is perfectly credible and qualified, and, for  
20 purposes of sentencing, based on permissible and, indeed,  
21 routine sources of information in determining matters of this  
22 kind.

23 It was your exhibit, Ms. Ryan. Why don't you mark it  
24 Plaintiff's Exhibit 1. It will be admitted over objection of  
25 the defendant and made a part of the record of this case.
